

Extended Library Services for the West Africa Center for Crop Improvement

Albert R. Mann Library at Cornell University is proud to extend its reference and information services to WACCI's plant breeding Ph.D. program at the University of Ghana at Accra, both to supplement the University library's existing resources and to help students when they are in the field conducting research.

Reference Services

Mann Library provides the following types of reference service:

- Answers to short factual inquiries and assistance with in-depth research questions and literature reviews
- Updates on the latest research via regularly e-mailed database search results (SDI alerts)

For example, we can find the definition of *chemigation*, send a list of articles on the effects of intercropping on crop yield for sorghum in Africa, email regular updates of new articles on a topic from the CAB Abstracts database, or tell you how to cite the articles in APA style in your bibliography.

How Reference Works

Send an email to mann_ref@cornell.edu. Identify yourself as a WACCI student and tell us what you need in as much detail as possible (Do you want a quick answer or in-depth research on a particular question? Ongoing email alerts? Have you searched elsewhere? Are you using particular scientific terms?). We will send you answers via email (or if too lengthy for easy download, via airmail).

Interlibrary Loan Services

Mann Library also provides copies of journal articles to WACCI students. Articles can be sent either via email as PDF files or as printouts via airmail. WACCI students may request whichever option is best for them based on their access to a reliable Internet connection.

Mann Library provides free document delivery from the print collections of Cornell University Library as a whole, not just Mann, Bailey Horticulture, Entomology, and the Library Annex.

If none of the Cornell University libraries own the item, Mann Library will also be able to provide up to 10 articles per year to each WACCI scholar through Interlibrary Loan.

How Interlibrary Loan Works

To request materials, please follow the procedures outlined below:

WACCI scholars should go to the following website: <http://cornell.hosts.atlas-sys.com/nonetid/logon.html>.

Please note that the URL (<http://cornell.hosts.atlas-sys.com/illiad/logon.html>) available on other Mann Library pages is not applicable to WACCI scholars. If you use it and are asked for a netID and password, click the Cancel button. On the next screen, choose the option that says "To log in using the old method (ILLiad username and password), click here."

Registration Process:

1. One time registration is required for this site. Click on the Register button at the logon page.
2. Fill out the entire Registration form with special attention to the following fields:

- a. Enter Cornell ID: 000111111 (three "zeros" followed by six "ones")
- b. Choose Status: "O – Mann Distance."
- c. Choose Interlibrary Loan Processing Unit: Mann Library
- d. Choose a username and password of your choice. Once you have registered successfully, you will be able to submit requests immediately.

Making Requests:

1. Login at the site with your chosen username and password
2. Click on Request an Article on the main menu
3. For the question "If there is a fee for this request, how would you like to pay for it?" choose Exempt
4. Fill out citation information for the article and click on Yes, Submit Request

Request Reviewing Requests:

It is also possible to check the status of your requests and keep track of your finished requests.

Mann ILS will not turn down e-mailed requests, but they will take much longer to fulfill than if submitted through the website.

TEEAL and AGORA

Students who are away from the resources available at the University of Ghana at Accra doing their field research may find that accessing resources either from the University or from the field organization is

difficult, because of distance and lack of Internet connectivity. In these cases, check to see if the field organization is eligible for two other agricultural information projects for developing countries that Mann Library is involved with: TEEAL and AGORA.

TEEAL (The Essential Electronic Agricultural Library) is a low-cost full-text and bibliographic library of over 130 of the world's most important scientific journals in the field of agriculture made available to institutions in 100 low-income countries on CDs (TEEAL) or via local area network (LanTEEAL). If your field site has computers but unreliable Internet connectivity (or none at all), TEEAL or LanTEEAL can be used to get access to journal literature. AGORA (Access to Global Online Literature in Agriculture), TEEAL's sister project, provides free or low-cost access via the Internet to over 1000 journals from major scientific publishers in the fields of food, agriculture, environmental science and related social sciences. AGORA is available to students and researchers in qualifying not-for-profit institutions in eligible developing countries. Unlike TEEAL, AGORA utilizes the Internet to deliver access to those who have good Internet connectivity. 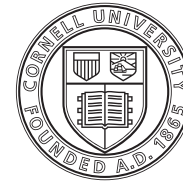

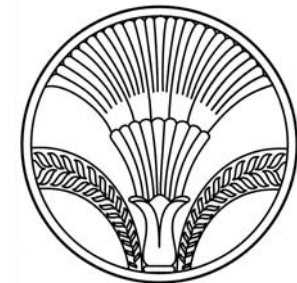
